It is particularly recommended for the lubrication of roller chains, slides and sprockets used in industrial drying, baking and coating processes.

HTOC 22 is formulated with premium base stocks and a proprietary additive system to provide excellent high temperature performance including low volatility and minimal residue forming tendency on wetted parts. HTOC 22 also provides superior solvency to help clean existing deposits from wetted parts. The light viscosity allows the lubricant to penetrate into critical pins and bushings of the drive chain where the antiwear additives provide protection against surge or shock loading to extended chain life. Corrosion and oxidation inhibitors further protect the chain and wetted parts against rust and corrosion.
