: Distillates (petroleum), hydrotreated heavy paraffinic: Mineral oil mists derived from highly refined oils are reported to have low acute and sub-acute toxicities in animals. Effects from single and short-term repeated exposures to high concentrations of mineral oil mists well above applicable workplace exposure levels include lung inflammatory reaction, lipoid granuloma formation and lipoid pneumonia. In acute and sub-acute studies involving exposures to lower concentrations of mineral oil mists at or near current work place exposure levels produced no significant toxicological effects.
Distillates (petroleum), hydrotreated light paraffinic: Mineral oil mists derived from

highly refined oils are reported to have low acute and sub-acute toxicities in animals. Effects from single and short-term repeated exposures to high concentrations of mineral oil mists well above applicable workplace exposure levels include lung inflammatory reaction, lipoid granuloma formation and lipoid pneumonia. In acute and sub-acute studies involving exposures to lower concentrations of mineral oil mists at or near current work place exposure levels produced no significant toxicological effects. **Alkoxy sulfolane**: In 28 day oral gavage studies, liver weight increases and eosinophilia of hepatocytes were noted in rats. These changes may be due to hepatic microsomal enzyme induction as both increased weight and eosinophilia are commonly observed in the livers of animals treated with known cytochrome P450 inducers. Also, minimal hypertrophy of the thyroid follicular epithelium was observed. Renal hyaline droplet changes were observed in this study which are consistent with male rat-specific nephropathy. The renal finding observed in male rats are likely not relevant to human health.
